### **STEP THREE**

Take out your Journal and use the acronym **S.O.A.P.** to guide you...

**S** Write down a passage of **SCRIPTURE** that stood out to you in that day's reading.

- O **Q** Write down **OBSERVATIONS**...what do you see in that Scripture, what was it about? Questions you have, things that grabbed you.
  
- A **A** How does it **APPLY** to you? What is God saying to you about what you read? How does it apply to your life?
  
- P **P** Write out a **PRAYER**, things you would like to say to God, your own personal thoughts and thanks to Him, requests people you are praying for. You don't have to write out everything you want to say to God, take some time to just be quiet and listen and talk to Him.
