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A LETTER FROM

Well, 2021 didn't seem to be much of an improvement over 2020, right? There still seemed to be a lot of polarization. There still seemed to be the indecision of whether to work from home or from the office. People wrestled with which outside-the-home activities to engage with or not. And just as we hoped we were turning a corner, we got hit with another covid variant.

So yes, it felt like 2021 had a lot of the same uncertainty as 2020.

Reflecting to the beginning of 2021, I wanted our church family to persevere through many of the things that were proving to be quite difficult, so we did a series called PERSEVERANCE, and we tied it to words that Jesus' younger brother said:

James1:2 "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything."

Consider it pure joy - this statement from James is given to those who are in the middle of difficult circumstances. We are to 'Choose Joy'. This was so important to us as a church that we actually had hoodies made up with the statement 'Choose Joy' written down the arm (speak to Alecia Dyck if you would like to still get yours!)

Even though we had several things this year that were less than ideal, these circumstances gave us the opportunity to 'Choose Joy.' Here are a few:

All Sunday Gatherings from January until the end of June were only online. The message was recorded and then uploaded along with a song on the end where we were encouraged to sing our praise to the Lord!

Another way we stayed connected was through the 'Sunday Connect' -- a zoom gathering where we would discuss the message and then pray for one another. For those who regularly joined this zoom group, it was quite enjoyable as we shared our lives together 'Choosing Joy'! In fact, some remarkable things happened on those Sundays, including getting to know others who were less familiar with church and faith.

The Family Room. Another thing we explored with our Sunday Gatherings came from these words from Paul where he said: 1Cor14:26 ... When you come together, each of you has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. Everything must be done so that the church may be built up. We called this monthly online gathering the 'Family Room' and right away experienced it as an amazingly refreshing time where several different people shared from their devotions what God had been showing them personally. Again, together we were able to 'Choose Joy!'

Our Small Groups have always been so crucial to our church family, as it is in our small groups where we are truly 'known' and 'loved'. But 2021 was not so easy on our small groups as they were continually needing to pivot along with new provincial restrictions on gathering. This meant going from being able to meet in our homes, to being limited to only having our 'safe six' in our home. Some made the most out of zoom meetings, while some met outside at their homes or outside the church or literally...outside! To say that this was easy to do would not be honest, but it sure gave us all another opportunity to 'Choose Joy'.

Then came July and for the first time in 16 months we were able to do Sunday Gatherings IN PERSON! I must say that there were many tears by those of us who had so badly missed being able to be together in this way. Even as I write these words I can remember the emotion I experienced being together with you all. But then what made this season quite challenging was the protocol that changed the way that we could gather once again. After 4 weeks of in-person we went back to online. This was hard - 'Choose Joy.' I tried.

September brought another protocol shift which allowed us to gather on Sundays again with certain restrictions; though not completely without challenges, this change was really important for us as a church family. For me personally, however, it came with a surprising setback: for the next 2 months I found myself dealing with some concerning health issues seemingly related to my heart that required me to step back from my involvements for a time. I so appreciated the 'prayers of the saints' as I was able to recover and return for November and to finish out the year with the refreshment that comes with being back with our church family.

As we move out of 2021 and into 2022 I suspect that everything is not going to be smooth, we will still face challenge, but my hope and prayer is that we will move in strong unity as we Choose Joy!

No matter what is going on around us, Jesus' mission hasn't been put on hold. We do not need to wait to 'keep going.' We just need to keep going with more...

- instruction from the Holy Spirit
- more steadfast obedience
- and more daily connection with Jesus through our devotions

I looked forward to another 21 Days of Prayer and this already has started the year off really well. Discipleship groups are happening and I look forward to seeing more added. We are planning on a Set Free, a marriage retreat again in April and I am looking forward to how the Lord will practically call us to B.L.E.S.S. our city (our 5 prayer requests for this year) and answer our prayer to see people far from Christ find salvation. I know there will be practical projects we will engage with, facility issues to pay attention to, hospitality extended to new people, additions to teams and small groups. In all of this, plans are made but we put ourselves in the Lord's hands to show us really: what's next?

We never know the journey ahead, and we never need to. **We once again place ourselves in the hands** of our Heavenly Father who is good and all His ways are good. As 2022 has now taken flight, here is some encouragement from a post I saw recently, slightly edited for our church family:

Please make sure to 'Choose Joy' once again by Making sure gratitude is secured and locked in the upright position. Let's meet with Jesus daily and let Him refine us and define us through His Spirit. And let's be one of those churches the Lord can smile on and see a people who are still pursuing passionate devotion to Jesus Christ.





A TIMELINE OF THE YEAR

With more pivots in 2021, here is a summary of the primary roles and responsibilities of SunRidge staff:



How I write a Sunday Message

As a pastor of SunRidge for 24 years I have prepared, preached, and recovered from well over 1,000 messages! It's quite a humbling experience to be placed in a role as a pastor and to trust in God's good grace to have a message make a difference in the lives of people. I was asked to give a window into the way that message preparation looks, so that for those of you who are interested, can understand a bit better what a large part of my working week looks like.

1. Engage in the world of the Listener

- this includes both believers and non-believers
- I assume that both groups are listening in
- Many concerns of both these groups are the same (eg marriage, parenting, etc)
- I befriend and meet with people regularly from both groups



2. Read, Read, Read

- I read across the spectrum of any given subject
- Often the books, articles, summaries, reviews give me a taste of the differing views
- I am selective on the books that I read as there is only so much time



3. My Devotions

- So often I find message ideas and even series ideas from my devotions and journaling
- ▶ When God is pointing at something in my own life I easily can relate
- My application in my devotions often can become something to be aware of as I prep the message



4. Themes Identification

- With some themes that have come from #1, #2, #3, I prayerfully plan
- > Things I consider are: seasons (eg Christmas, Easter, Summer, Fall, etc.)
- What is needed in the life of our church; sometimes a topical series: (eg parenting, finance, evangelism, discipleship). Sometimes a biblical book series: (eg Galatians = Gospel, Song of Solomon = Marriage etc.)



5. Calendar Time

- Now that I have themes identified, I get my calendar out and I prayerfully plot the weeks / months ahead
- I try to work this exercise out with the staff team for refinement
- Here is where we also consider the placement of: Family Room, 21 Days of Prayer, Marriage Retreat, etc.


6. Actual Message Prep

- I begin with doing a read over the passage of scripture that is central to the message
- I make notes on what really grabs me as I read and reread the passage
- Then I write a one sentence summary of the passage the "big idea"
- Along with reading that I have already done in research for the message series, I also go to commentaries and other preachers on how they have to say about it



7. Ask Questions of the Message

- ▶ I ask: what, why, how, where or what issue is met or resolved in Jesus
- This helps me build the skeleton in which the message flows



- ▶ Take the parts and prayerfully put the parts together
- Bring in supporting examples, illustrations, books read, etc.
- The time for this varies. It begins in small pieces over the course of a few days as I approach it and step away from it to let it "brew." After that I always reserve one full day of bringing it together, writing and revising (not counting if I need to post the message online and prepare SG Questions)



9. Live With The Message

- ▶ I try and give time for the message to marinate after it is written
- As I step away, God often brings to my attention something in the message that needs attention



10. Final Revision

- I prayerfully go through the message asking God to use it for His Glory and Purposes
- I often will make changes at this point adding or deleting from my manuscript




What goes into music at SunRidge?

I'm so grateful that we were able to run youth ministry for the whole year! We started out gathering in the auditorium around tables until mid march. We then went back into the portable which we hadn't done in almost a year and a half!

We gave the portable a refresher with some new fun set ups, we've even got monkey bars now. The basketball court has been AMAZING and I'm so excited for the snow to melt so we can get back out there!

We said goodbye to lots of graduating students in June of 2021 and welcomed lots of new faces!

Our numbers have fluctuated more then I've ever seen, where some nights we've gotten close to 40 of us and other weeks there's 10 of us. I try to schedule youth so that every other week we are playing games and having events and then the other nights of youth we are walking through something called, "living Christian" which is the discipleship class we've been walking through but modified slightly for a younger audience.

For myself, youth continues to be such an incredible journey and something that I'm so grateful to be a part of. I'm surrounded by great leaders, Cole and Mary Hubshur, Kaden, Nikki, Matt Unrau, Alecia and myself. The team is awesome and each person brings something uniques to team. Having Skye (my 10 month old daughter) at youth is a really amazing thing. It's incredible to see the generational piece in my own life. It's been such a reminder to me to continue to meet with students and teach them about scripture, devotionals and what we are called to do and to be as Christians.

For myself personally, it's been a trying season. I'm excited for what lays on the horizon for youth. I'm excited and grateful to continue to lead in this capacity.

PRODUCTION

Our goal in Production is to build an environment where the Lord is glorified and His people are edified. Our hearts and voices lift the goodness of God and our souls are fed by His Word. We hope to accomplish that by the songs we sing, the prayers we pray, and messages we teach when we Gather.

SunRidge loves to sing together as we gather for worship. I know that because quite often I have a drummer right behind me and I can hear you singing over that! There's many moving pieces involved for our singing to happen week after week: A band needs to be assembled and rehearsed, a sound person needs to run the mixing board, a media person needs to operate the slides, and since we began to livestream, a video person needs to run the stream. These are all volunteer run and I extend my sincere gratitude to all involved. Most of 2021 was very simplified for this ministry. We would put together a weekly online message followed by a single song (with words on the screen). If you had a "behind the scenes" viewpoint on that operation, what you would've seen was a tripod with my iPhone mounted on it and a sheet of music taped to it. Quite the "production" to be sure. We would schedule these online messages & songs to go live on Facebook at 10am Sunday mornings, and then chat in the comments with whoever joined the livestream.

When that changed in July and we began to meet in person, I was thrilled to be playing alongside SunRidge musicians once again. Since then, we've enjoyed singing with each other during our Sunday Gatherings whether it's a big band or more acoustic styled. During the Family Room (last Sunday of the month), it's been amazing to get children involved with percussion, helping with the soundboard, and running the slides.

SMALL GROUPS

Our walk of faith is something we do together. When Jesus began His earthly ministry, one of the first things He did was call a group of guys to join Him. He called fishermen, tax collectors, and zealots to follow Him, learn from Him, and lead like Him. Our Small Groups take that call seriously. We regularly meet up to get into the bible, into the message of the week, and do our best to apply what we've learned to an area in our lives.

Our desire is that everyone would find their fit in one of our Small Groups. These groups happen on almost any day of the week and they truly are the place where friends become family. Throughout this past year, many of our meetings have had to happen online, in backyards, or at coffee shops. SunRidge has also made our facility available for groups to book and we have a number of comfortable spaces to connect. 80 people are connected in Small Groups at SunRidge! There have been many interesting ways to connect in Small Groups. Covid has presented us with challenges for sure - meetings that would've typically happened in living rooms had to change things up. Young Adults met at a coffee shop to watch the message and then walk to discuss it. Other groups would do a lunch in the Church Foyer. Some found that meeting on Zoom was actually more convenient for people to connect - especially if some people were joining in from a different continent! Other groups found that their numbers were too big so they had to branch off and create 2 groups. Whatever covid changed, our desire to continue meeting together stayed strong and we found a way!

We would like to thank our Small Group Leaders and the efforts they have put forth to care for our people in 2021. You have exemplified endurance and a lasting faith. The way you prepare and engage week after week is an inspiration. Well done!

DISCIPLESHIP GROUPS

Even though 2022 is starting off with many uncertainties, I believe the learnings of 2021 have actually served to prepare and strengthen us for the days ahead.

A word we used a lot in 2021 was 'Pivot.' Every time I hear it used I am pulled back into my past highschool basketball-playing days. It was here that my coach would stand in front of the team and demonstrate how important a pivot was as he left one foot planted on the ground while moving the other foot in a multitude of directions – adapting our position.

It is clear that a church that has not pivoted during the pandemic is in trouble, because we have to adapt. Jesus pivoted—He was on his way to do one thing, but another need came and He pivoted to the need in front of Him. We too have had to and will have to make appropriate changes to reach a changing culture as well.

A new reality moving forward will also be summed up in this phrase: We have to go to where the people are. For us, this is going to require an even more intentional online presence so that people, wherever they are, will be able to join us digitally just as the rest of us gather in person. We learned something about that in 2021 and this will help us in 2022; we will need to make this a priority moving into this new year.

What we want to stay clear on is what Jesus has asked of us as His followers:

Make Disciples that will Make Disciples. There has never been a year when this command has been benched. Over 2,000 years in times of favor and in times of persecution, peace and war, famine and plenty it has never been retracted. It wasn't retracted in 2021, but the "how" became more creative and we learned from this too.

Discipleship needs to be central to everything that we do as a church. 2021 gave us a new way of doing this as it pushed us to meet online; this has become a great platform to easily meet for one hour, once a month without requiring anyone to leave their home! It is so doable! So in 2022 we are again offering Discipleship Groups which meet online once a month.

Where we intentionally work through both the teaching of and the practicing of 'spiritual practices.' This gives us the necessary preparation to teach them and practice them to someone else. Disciples making disciples.

My hope is that everyone in SunRidge would take the mandate of Discipleship seriously. For 2022 we are going to do our best to encourage all our Small Group Leaders to participate in one of these groups so that they in turn can spread it out to others.

Time is short and so we want to do our best to equip each one of you for the days that lie ahead.

We don't live in the past nor try to recapture the past. We move forward and break new ground, grabbing onto the new opportunities Jesus always puts in front of us. His voice rings out as loud as ever in 2022 to do "new things" to Make Disciples that will Make Disciples.

SUNLAND & OUT-OF-SCHOOL CARE

A new volunteer team for Sunland was formed and trained

We currently have 11 volunteers on the team (but we need more!)

A summer program called "Play Dates" was formed. We supported families by creating safe connections and fellowship for parents and children during the isolating times of COVID.

> Several new families discovered SunRidge as a result and are now regular attendees to our church.

A Fall/Winter program called "Date Nights" was formed. We offered OOSC/SunRidge families a place to babysit their children so that parents could strengthen marriages, have some time to meet friends or just have some "me time".

- Date Night events have been at full or near full capacity.
- ▶ About 60% of the parents are from our OOSC program, with the remainder being from SunRidge.
- Many of the participants have used Date Night to enjoy dates with spouses, with a parent, or with other couples on a "double date". The feedback has been very positive and there seems to be a great need for this event continuing into the future.
- ▶ In January, we will be trialing "Daytime Date Night" for parents of very young children. This event will be Date Night, but from 11am-2pm, which we think will be better for parents with toddlers.
- We currently offer Date Night events once per month and charge 2 dollars to cover the cost of food.

LiTE program (an OOSC program): We re-started a program called LiTE which stands for "Leaders in Training Experience. This program is a leadership/character education program for OOSC students who are in grade 4 and 5.

- ▶ LiTE offers leadership training to these students and gives them roles of responsibility
- ▶ LiTE leaders plan events and execute them with the younger children
- LiTE leaders are taught how to be positive role models to the younger children
- LiTE leaders enjoy special events outside of OOSC hours

Looking Ahead:

- Date Night will continue to be a monthly event; hopefully on the second Friday of every month.
- Play Dates will resume in June.
- I am hoping to host a Parent Training Event called: "Parenting in a Tech World" which is a program developed by Parent Cue. I am trialing the content and will likely offer it to OOSC/ Sunland in the Spring.
- I would like to host a Home School Co-op at SunRidge to home schooling parents in the community. This idea is in early stages of development.



Summary

Although slightly short of budget, Sunday offerings were less than 2% below expectations, which is a testament to God's faithfulness to our Church through the generosity of our people.

Overall income was slightly ahead of budget at \$288.3k. The overage was primarily driven by special offerings related to Student Ministries and some unexpected facility rental income.

The total expenses for the year were marginally overbudget, primarily due to some one-off costs and a strategic shift in digital arts investment. Here are some of the highlights regarding our spending this year:

The slight overage in wage spend comes from the good fortune of finding Jon Ransom earlier than budgeted, so we carried the extra wage for slightly longer than budgeted.

Facility spend was basically on budget except for some unanticipated church van expenses.

The digital arts and design spend reflects an increase focus on the digital arts as an expression of our ministry efforts, as well as the recent re-brand. We expect this level of investment to continue.

Ministry budgets reflect a somewhat disjointed ministry year. Covid restrictions prevented some ministries from operating the full year, which contributed to an underspend in some areas.

The Out of School Care "surplus" is somewhat overstated as there are some expenses that are not included in the financial statements for that ministry. The important ones would include facilities rent, all costs associated to the church van, and insurance. The ministry is effectively breakeven after these costs are included, which is our intent. OOSC was always designed to be a ministry to families in our area rather than a for-profit enterprise and we are grateful for the work Jon and his staff do there.

Overall we have finished up 2021 in very good financial health. Operational spending was largely in line with income and we also completed the student court during the year as our primary capital expenditure to support Student Ministries. As our facility continues to show its age we are anticipating some more capital expenditures in the next 1 – 2 years to refresh the building and ensure it can support us for years to come.
